Although students may enroll in social work as a major, there is a formal admission process into the social work program. To be eligible for admission to the social work program, students must meet the following criteria:

- ❖ Cumulative GPA of 2.0
- ❖ The liberal arts requirements marked with an * must be completed.
- ❖ Completion of two of the following social work courses with a minimum grade of C:
 - SW 3003 Social Work with At-Risk Populations
 - SW 2303 Social Welfare Policy I
 - SW 3013 Human Behavior in the Social Environment
- ❖ Completion of SW 2313 Introduction to Social Work (including 20 hours of service learning experience) with a minimum grade of B.
- ❖ Completion of an Application for Admission to the Social Work Program.
- ❖ Students must provide three reference letters on provided forms.
- ❖ Authorize a background check, child abuse/neglect and sex offender registries.
- ❖ Participate in a personal interview with Social Work Program Administrators Committee

Before enrolling in any social work classes, it is the responsibility of the student to consult with their social work advisor regarding any prerequisites for social work classes.
