SW 4916 Field Practicum I and SW 4926 Field Practicum/Seminar II require students to complete 450 hours in a 8 am -5 pm Monday through Thursday block practicum.

To remain in the MSU Meridian Social Work program and enter Field Practicum, students must:

- Complete the Field Practicum Application Process.
- Maintain an overall GPA of 2.0, with a 2.5 GPA or better for all Social Work courses. <u>Must earn a minimum of "C" in each</u> <u>Social Work course.</u>
- * Adhere to all academic expectations of the university and the Social Work program
- * Adhere to the National Association of Social Workers Code of Ethics
- Complete a fingerprint criminal history, child abuse/neglect registry check, and sex offender registry check.

<u>Academic credit for life experience and previous work experience will not be given, in whole or in part, in lieu of the field</u> practicum or of the courses in the professional foundation areas, specifically Social Work Practice I, II and III.
